
The article mostly focuses on the lending model, and social capital is considered as a factor in increasing solvency. Therefore, it is advisable to adjust the title of the article in the following direction: increasing solvency by moderating social capital.


The hypothesis that the internal attitude and formation of the group, the ability of the group to evaluate loans, good group control over loans are characteristics of social capital, is absent. In 1.2, 1.2.1, 1.2.2, 1.2.3, only a description of such components of social capital as trust, norms, network communication is given. However, their relationship with Group solvency ratios from hypotheses 1-3, in our opinion, is not proven. Therefore, the transition from hypotheses 1-3 to hypothesis 4 seems illogical.Repetition of the sentence "Trust, norms, and social networks are key concepts of social capital," at the end of 1.2. It is worth clarifying the title of Table 2, indicating the direction of application of variables and indicators.5. The indicators given in Table 2 do not have a quantitative dimension (with the exception of 0 = productive economic group1 = women's savings and loan group), so it is not clear how these were used in the regression analysis.6. It is worth explaining how the variables GIS_SC and GLC_SC were evaluated.7. It is necessary to $explain \ which \ indicators \ are \ given \ in \ table \ 4. 


